

Beginning this month of November, I will be offering the opportunity for **all** students of Travell to join me for lunch! This time will be meant for your child to meet with other students in a small group and enjoy fun games & conversations that will promote social emotional skills, especially as they relate to self-confidence and interpersonal relationship building; *skills that can continuously be enhanced*.

This year, students in Grades K & 1 will be selected weekly by their classroom teachers. Students in Grades 2-5 will be selected by myself, *at random*, and provided the chance to choose **one** friend who will accompany them. <u>Eight</u> will be the maximum number of students per group.

Students from each grade level will be selected once per week to join me for their **lunch period**. Recess will <u>not</u> be affected by this opportunity! If students are absent, they will of course be reselected at another point. If students wish to pass, *they may decline the invitation* at any time.

Students and teachers alike have been **eagerly** awaiting the return of the program this year. It is something I <u>genuinely</u> look forward to as well as it allows me the opportunity to build relationships with all of your children in a *proactive*, *strengths-based*, *positive* environment.

Lunch Bunch also allows students to meet and get to know other Travell Tigers they may not have engaged with otherwise; in turn, expanding their friendship circle and therefore, support system. In addition, it provides a safe place for students to practice different social emotional skills and build confidence in a smaller setting before taking risks in the classroom, less structured Tiger's Den or even outside in the much larger group at recess.

I will plan to extend the Lunch Bunch invitation to all students, as they are selected, unless I have received email communication stating you would prefer your child not be included.
